Programme for the History of Medicine Course

September 2017 to June 2018

In preparation for the Diploma in the History of Medicine Examination (DHMSA)

Eight lecture sessions will be held on fifteen Saturday mornings from 9 September 2017 to 2 June 2018, some at **Apothecaries' Hall**, Black Friars Lane, London EC4V 6EJ and five at the **Wellcome Collection, 183 Euston Road**, London NW1 2BE. One session will be held at **London Metropolitan Archives, 40 Northampton Road, Clerkenwell, EC1R 0HB** and another session at **Guy's Hospital near London Bridge**.

Lectures begin promptly at 10:00am and finish at approximately 12:15pm. The afternoon lectures begin promptly at 1.30pm and finish at 3.45pm (at Apothecaries Hall) and at 5pm (at the Wellcome Collection, Guy's and Metropolitan Archives). Coffee and tea are provided each morning and afternoon during the breaks. Lunch is not provided but there are several cafés close by.

The course is supported by the Wellcome Library (<http://wellcomelibrary.org/>). The eponymous lectures are not part of the course but do form an important part of the Society's history teaching, as does the three-day Intensive Course in the History of Medicine on 2 to 4 July 2018.
